Throughout the Commonwealth Karate Championships, the World Karate Federation (WKF) rules will be applied and as such only WKF approved protective equipment (inclusive of chest, leg, feet and hand protection) will be permitted. It is COMPULSORY for athletes competing in the Commonwealth Elite championship to wear WKF approved attire Athletes competing in the club component WKF approved attire is optional.

The WKF and Karate South Africa (KSA) comply with the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) code of practice and adopt a strict stance on anti-doping. Therefore, WADA rules will be stringently applied throughout the championships. A dedicated well facilitated room for WADA is assigned in the venue.

The CKF Championship will comprise of two events, namely the 11th Commonwealth Karate Championship (Elite) which will only be open to National Team athletes and the Commonwealth Karate Club Championships will be open to all Commonwealth karateka that are members of the WKF.

At the Commonwealth Karate Championships-Elite there will only be two athletes allowed in each category per National Team. However, in the Commonwealth Club Championships (which will take place after the Elite event is concluded) there will be no limit on the number of entries per category.

The two-day Commonwealth Karate Championship-Elite event will take place on Thursday 28th and Friday 29th November. The Commonwealth Club Championship will follow and take place on Saturday 30th November and Sunday 01st of December. Registration for Events both is already open through sports data.

All registration in the CKF Championship must be processed ONLINE via Sportdata. Onsite registrations will NOT be accepted. The registration will be validated once completed with the online payment through the payment platform.

National Federations are responsible for the quality of the entered registration data. The online registration of athletes will be openly disclosed for everyone from the beginning, allowing consultation by CKF National Federations of the competitors registered in real-time.

To assist in the Officiating of this Event it would be appreciated if all participating Countries could make available Judge / Referees. To register an Official each Country should complete the relevant section on Sportdata. (Note, National Referee qualification is acceptable).

Any issue regarding the online registration must be notified to the software provider and to the CKF at the latest five days before the first day of competition to enable consideration without altering the smooth running of the process. Sportdata will provide live timing with a rundown of days before the start of the event the online registration will close. Please note that no entries will be accepted after the closing date. Commonwealth Karate Championship(Elite) & Commonwealth Karate Club Championship:

The official accreditation will take place on 27th November 2024 from 09am to 4pm at Comp Venue

If changes are required during the official registration session, because of incorrect or missing registration data, a fee of 40\$(usd) is charged for each change. At registration, accreditation cards will be issued with the participant's main data, a photograph, and information about registered categories. The accreditation card must always be worn during the event. Only members of national federations recognised by CKF are permitted to participate, as per the CKF Organising Rules 2024. All participants must submit an official document (passport or other valid ID card) for the CKF identification and validation at the accreditation session. Any competitor who has not collected, either personally or through his/her coach their accreditation during the official registration, will not be included in the draw. The weighing will be carried out immediately after receiving the accreditation, those athletes who will not attend the weighing will not be included in the draw.



VISA REQUIREMENTS

General information about South African visas

Visitor's visas are for International travellers who have permanent residence outside South Africa and who wish to visit the country on a temporary basis for tourism, sport or business purposes for 90 days or less.

Requirements for visitor's visas differ from country to country. Countries that are exempt from needing a South African visa can be found on the following web-link

www.home-affairs.gov.za/index.php/countries-exempt-from-sa-visas

As each application is treated individually you should make enquiries with your nearest South African Embassy or Consulate.

Documents required for a visa:

- A valid passport
- The passport must have at least one unused page A completed BI–84 (application for visa form)
- Payment of the prescribed fee
- A yellow fever vaccination certificate (if required)
- Statement and/or documentation confirming the purpose and duration of your visit Two colour passport photographs
- A return or onward ticket

If you have children (minors) travelling with you or joining you in South Africa, you will need to provide the following additional documents: Proof of guardianship or consent from the guardian in the case of an unaccompanied minor.

Proof of financial means in the form of:

- Salary advices
- Undertaking by the South African Host Bursary
- Medical cover Cash available.

DURBAN, SOUTH AFRICA DETAILS

Welcome to Durban South Africa

Durban (Zulu: eThekwini, from itheku meaning 'bay / lagoon') is the largest city in the South African province of KwaZulu-Natal. It is also the second most important manufacturing hub in South Africa after Johannesburg.

Durban is famous for being the busiest port in South Africa and Africa. It is also seen as one of the major centres of tourism because of the city's warm subtropical climate and extensive beaches. The municipality, which includes neighbouring towns, has a population of almost

3.5 million, making the combined municipality the biggest city on the east coast of the African continent. The metropolitan land area of 2,292 square km (885 sq mi) is comparatively larger than other South African cities.

Durban has a humid subtropical climate with hot and humid summers and pleasantly warm and dry winters, which are frost-free. Durban has an annual rainfall of 1,009 mm (39.7 in) The average temperature in summer ranges around 28 °C (82 °F) while in winter the average temperature is 20 °C (68 °F). Sunrise in Durban on summer solstice occurs at 04h45 and sunset at 19h00; on winter solstice sunrise is at 06h30 and sunset at 17h20. The rainy season is in summer which begins sometime in November, ending in mid-April. Summers are sunny, hot and humid during the day, but are relieved by afternoon or evening thunderstorms.

The city is also occasionally affected by tropical storms and cyclones during the cyclone season which is from 15 November to 30 April. Winters, which are from June to August, are generally warm and sunny. Durban and its suburbs are hilly, except for locations in and around the central business district and the harbour.

South Africa is a multi-ethnic society encompassing a wide variety of cultures, languages, and religions. Its pluralistic makeup is reflected in the constitution's recognition of 11 official languages, which is among the highest number of any country in the world. Two of these languages are of European origin: English and Afrikaans, the latter originating from Dutch and serving as the main language of most white and coloured South Africans. Though English is commonly used in public and commercial life, it is only the fifth most-spoken home language.


About 80% of South Africans are of black African ancestry, divided among a variety of ethnic groups speaking different Bantu languages, nine of which have official status. The remaining population consists of Africa's largest communities of European, Asian, and multiracial ancestry. All ethnic and linguistic groups have political representation in the country's constitutional democracy, which comprises a parliamentary republic and nine provinces. Since the end of apartheid, South Africa's unique multicultural character has become integral to its national identity, as expounded upon by the Rainbow Nation concept.

South Africa is ranked as an upper-middle income economy by the World Bank, and is considered to be a newly industrialised country. Its economy is the largest and most developed in Africa and the 28th-largest in the world. In terms of purchasing power parity, South Africa has the fifth-highest per capita income in Africa, although poverty and inequality remain widespread, with about a quarter of the population unemployed and living on less than US\$1.25 a day) Nevertheless, South Africa has been identified as a middle power in international affairs, and maintains significant regional influence.
